Key information to support education staff in making a decision:

Key questions to consider:

- What is the nature and context of the concerning behaviour?
- What ages are the people involved (including any adults), and any power imbalance?
- What is the developmental stage of the young person/s involved?
- Is there a pattern or escalation in concerning behaviour?
- Is there any evidence of illegal behaviour, malicious intent, threats, coercion, grooming, exploitation or violence?
- Are there any relevant factors, circumstances, or vulnerabilities that need to be considered?
- What has been the impact for the young person/s?
- What are the wishes of the young person/s concerned?
- Is there any immediate risk to the young person/s?
- Is any further information required?
- Do I need to make any further referrals or contact anyone else?
